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Camp Guidelines:

1. C.E.F. cannot provide telephone service during CYIA Training School. Students are not allowed to have free use of cell phones but cell phones are permitted **at limited times**.
2. All activities will be under staff supervision.
3. Boy-Girl relationships will be on hold during the CYIA Training School.
4. Dress Code –Please follow the guidelines as detailed online & briefly below. You agreed to the following when completing your application:
 - All clothing must be neat and in good condition. Cool, casual, loose fitting, modest apparel is permitted. Pajamas should follow the same modesty guidelines.
 - Dresses/skirts - **knee length or longer**, Shorts – **finger-tip length or longer**. No short shorts, baggy pants off the hips, or low risers. **Leggings and bike shorts may not be worn as pants. Stretch pants or exercise clothes are not appropriate.**
 - **No tight**, suggestive, or see-through attire. No tank tops, bare midriffs, half shirts, net shirts, low-cut necklines, spaghetti straps, or clothing with questionable words/designs.
 - Shoes must be worn inside common areas. Tennis shoes are recommended for games.
 - Swimwear: Girls- one piece covered by sports shorts & dark shirt. Boys – shorts & shirt
 - **Anyone wearing any inappropriate attire will be asked to change.**
5. Everyone is expected to follow the schedule and be on time to meals, activities, and class.
6. **Remember Lights Out Time.** Be courteous to allow the staff and students to rest.
7. **Your books and teaching materials should be treated with care.** You should mark all your materials in a discrete location on the back with your name and put a luggage tag on your bag.
8. **Drinks and food are allowed only in designated areas.**
9. **Name tags** will be issued – wear them. 😊
10. **Any thing** that is “questionable” should be **left at home!**
11. **Be thoughtful of others by picking up after yourself & practicing good health measures:**
 1. Make your bed each morning. Keep the floor CLEAR and CLEAN (esp. of dirty clothing)
 2. Keep your personal hygiene items in your area (**not the bathroom**).
 3. Dispose of trash (paper, cans, or bottles, etc.) in the proper place.
 4. We will do a detailed cleaning before we leave for home.

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What to Bring to CYIA Camp

The Essentials:

- ☐ ESV version Bible - to match materials (Please put your name in it)
- ☐ CYIA bag of teaching materials with labeled luggage tag
- ☐ Your completed Bible Lesson or Missionary Story outlines
- ☐ Extra Notebook (To keep notes in about lessons, ideas, etc.)
- ☐ Pen, pencil, highlighters, sticky tabs for marking Bible/materials
- ☐ Bedding – sleeping bag or sheets, pillow and blanket
- ☐ Toiletries (sunscreen, shampoo, toothpaste, etc.) and shower bag/caddy
- ☐ Clothing for one week (see camp guidelines for dress code)
 - Tennis shoes for games & flip flops for shower are recommended
 - All items should be modest including swimming attire and pajamas
- ☐ Towels
- ☐ Any medicine you take regularly or might need while at camp in original containers. We recommend packing vitamins!
- ☐ Water bottle labeled with name
- ☐ A good attitude, a willingness to work hard, and the ability to forgive easily.

Please mark all of your items with your name and attach a luggage tag to your materials bag to identify it as yours.

Optional :

- ☐ Money for souvenirs, snack shop, and missions offering (missionary attending)
- ☐ Cell phone (will be limited and will be kept in cabin during all teaching times)
- ☐ Charger for your phone, but please label it with your name.
- ☐ Camera (to capture some of these memories!)

Any of the non-essential items may be confiscated until the end of camp should they become a distraction and/or a nuisance. Parents will be notified if any of the above items have to be confiscated.
