Do you remember the memory verse? If you need help, look at this paper in the mirror.



Day 2 O READ ABOUT IT!

—John 1:17

• PRAY ABOUT IT!

Have you ever stopped to thank Jesus for His grace? Thank God right now for helping us know how to please Him. Then thank Him for sending Jesus so we can be forgiven.

O THINK ABOUT IT!

If you are under the dominion of something, it has control over you. If you have Jesus as your Savior, sin doesn't control you anymore. God's grace does. You don't have to sin! God's grace gives you power to live His way.

O THINK ABOUT IT!

—Galatians 5:13


• PRAY ABOUT IT!

If you know Jesus as your Savior, ask Him to help you use your freedom to love and serve other people. Thank Him for giving you grace!

O THINK ABOUT IT!

Sometimes it's hard to obey God. That's okay! God's grace is enough for you if you have Jesus as your Savior. God's grace gives you the power to do the right thing. And even when you choose to sin, God's grace is so great He will never stop loving you. He has forgiven you and can help you make a better choice next time.

When the verse says that God's grace is sufficient, it means it is all you need to live for Him! Draw water overflowing out of the cup. Remember that God's grace is more than enough for you.



O THINK ABOUT IT!

Some people might say, "God gives me grace. That means I am free to sin whenever I want because God will forgive me!" That's not the right attitude to have. This verse says that instead of using your freedom as an excuse to sin, you should use it to serve other people—to love them!
